Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

 Puppet Play - Make your own puppets and act out social situations and emotions. This is a good way to develop a child's recognition and understanding of emotions and managing social scenarios and feelings. Make your stories fun! You can use wooden spoons to make puppets or we have uploaded some FARM puppets you could enjoy.

World Around Us:

- Talk to your child about where vegetables grow and what kinds of things we can get from farms. We will be talking about the job a farmer does.
- The children will also plant and take home a sunflower seed to care for. *Plant & Play* sessions have helped the children discover what plants need to grow.

Physical Development & Movement:

• Bunny Tag: Pick one child to be the chaser and everyone else can be the bunnies. The bunnies hop away from the fast walking chaser. If they are caught they crouch down and use their hands to make bunny ears on top of their head until the end of the game. The last bunny caught becomes the chaser.
