## Make a blossom picture at home with this easy finger painting activity.

- **1.** Stick a **twig** to some **card**. Let it dry.
- 2. Pour some white and pink paint onto a paper plate.
- **3.** Dip your little one's fingers into the paint and help them dab it alongside the twig to create blossom. Easy peasy!

## Look out for blossom growing on trees and hedges in spring.
